TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

- 1. **The fundamental prerequisite of** being accepted to the graduate study programmes (second degree) is full completion of the undergraduate university studies (first degree) (Higher Education Act, n.131/2002 Coll.).
- 2. **Language competence** written and oral command of Slovak or Czech. Studying at the faculty, including the opportunity of spending a part of your study abroad, calls for a need of mastering at least one of the world languages minimally in the scope of the high school curriculum (English, German, Spanish, French, Russian).
- 3. **Health certificates** the faculty does not require any health certificates and accepts all the applications without any health certificates for all degrees of the university studies.



FORMS OF ADMISSION

Selection Procedure

Admission procedure is carried out in a form of a selection procedure in order to ensure that the admitted candidates
dispose of the necessary skills and abilities. The admission committee, on the basis of results of the entrance examination, determines the point limit with a minimum number of points (of total points) required for admission of the applicant.

Rules of Selection Procedure

MEDIAMATICS AND CULTURAL HERITAGE

The graduates of the bachelor´s study programme Mediamatics and Cultural Heritage in the field of study Library and Information Science from the Faculty of Humanities UNIZA or more precisely the Faculty of Natural Sciences are admitted without entrance exams. Graduates from other universities of the same or related field of study: applicant chooses three books or articles from the proposed list of professional literature (the list will be published on the website of the Department of Mediamatics and Cultural Heritage UNIZA) and takes part in an oral interview.

TEACHER TRAINING STUDY PROGRAMMES:

The applicants are admitted on the basis of the following criteria:

Teaching in Combination: English Language and Literature

The admission requirement for the second degree of university studies (master's degree) is the full completion of the first degree of university studies (bachelor's degree) in the same study programme. The graduates from the Faculty of Humanities UNIZA with their grade average up to 1.75 are admitted without entrance exams. Other applicants for study (with worse grade average or from other faculties or universities) will attend the entrance examination that consists of two parts:

- 1. a colloquial test to verify the applicant's abilities to complete the second degree of university studies,
- 2. bachelor's thesis discussion.

Teaching of Citizenship Education, Teaching in Combination: Citizenship Education

The admission requirement for the second degree of university studies (master´s) is full completion of the first degree of university studies (bachelor´s degree) in the same study programme. The graduates from the Faculty of Humanities UNIZA with their grade average up to 1.75 are admitted without entrance exams.

Other applicants for study (with worse grade average or from other faculties or universities) will attend the entrance (colloquial) examination to verify their abilities to complete the second degree of university studies that will have the oral form and will consist of three parts:

- 1. Bachelor's thesis discussion 10 points,
- 2. methodology of Citizenship Education 20 points,
- 3. Humanities and Social Sciences 20 points.

Total: 50 points.

Teaching in Combination: Religious Studies

Applicants who meet the essential requirements for admission for higher education of the second degree as stated in the Higher Education Act are admitted for the master's degree under the following criteria:

The graduates from the Faculty of Humanities UNIZA will be admitted without the entrance interview if they completed the bachelor's degree in the relevant field of study with a grade average up to 1.25.

Other applicants with worse grade average or applicants from other faculties and universities will attend the entrance (colloquial) examination to verify their abilities to complete the second degree of university studies that will have the oral form and will consist of three parts:

- 1. Bachelor's thesis discussion 10 points,
- 2. methodology of Religious Education 20 points,
- 3. Theology and Religious Studies 20 points.

Total: 50 points.



ADMISSION OF FOREIGN STUDENTS

Foreign students who study in a foreign language (i.e. not Slovak), pay the tuition fee as stated in § 92 Subsection 8 (Higher Education Act). The tuition fee is specified by the UNIZA directive for the respective academic year, which can be found on the university website.

Students from abroad who study in the Slovak language do not have to pay the tuition fee. The applicants from the Czech Republic who want to apply and study in Žilina can use the application form available in the Czech Republic. The applicants who do not actively speak Slovak or Czech are required to attend the language training. (It is possible to attend the Slovak for Foreigners courses at UNIZA).

For foreign applicants who were accepted on the basis of international agreements or Slovak government grants, terms and conditions stated in respective agreements are applicable.



HOW TO APPLY

Application forms are to be submitted for individual study programmes.

In case the applicant is interested in more study programmes, it is necessary to apply for each one individually, including payment of the respective admission procedure fees.

Applicants have to fill in the form Prihláška na vysokoškolské štúdium - 2. stupeň or they can also use an electronic application form that can be found on the university website: https://vzdelavanie.uniza.sk/prijimacky/index.php or on the education portal: https://prihlaskavs.sk/sk/.

Even in case of electronic application form, it is required to print it, sign it, enclose other required documents including the proof of payment of the fee and send it to the address of the Faculty of Humanities UNIZA within the stipulated deadlines.

Incomplete application form or the application form sent after the deadline will not be accepted.

In the absence or failure of entrance exams, the faculty does not refund the admission fee.

If an applicant wants to take part in entrance exams at more faculties of UNIZA, the application forms have to be sent separately to each faculty and the respective admission procedure fees paid separately to each faculty.

Tuition fees - in accordance with the Higher Education Act, information about the amount of tuition for the respective academic year will be announced on the website of the University of Žilina.

Students can use services of catering facilities at the University of Žilina. The prices vary from 0,80 € to 2,30 €.



MASTER'S STUDY PROGRAMMES

MEDIAMATICS AND CULTURAL HERITAGE

(Field of study 3.2.4 Library and Information Science)

The graduates are able to solve topical problems in the area of library and information practice. They are able to creatively apply knowledge mainly in the field of library and information funds and in local and global information resources. The graduates master the work with information and communication technologies, with methods and tools for creation and building of information sources, for the analysis of information needs, information retrieval, analysis of sources of information and providing of information and knowledge to users. They are able to work as content makers, or as managers of mediamatic information systems, as consultants in the field of information systems, or as course makers for e-learning. In addition, they are able to work as managers of information and knowledge databases in business organisations. After graduation, they can independently run a business in the sphere of mass media, provide information services for government, for the third sector or to work as specialists in creation and presentation of information, economics and management of mediamatic systems.

TEACHING IN COMBINATION WITH THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE

(Field of study 1.1.1 Teaching Academic Subjects)

The graduates acquire competences to work at primary schools, secondary schools and universities as fully qualified teachers.

TEACHING IN COMBINATION WITH CITIZENSHIP EDUCATION
